THE DISCIPLINE:

Accounting has been called the language of business in which accountants control, analyze, and report the financial resources of an enterprise. A good understanding of accounting principles and practices can serve as the basis for a career in any business field.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

Accountants provide critical input and guidance in profit-seeking organizations, service and charitable organizations, educational institutions, government, public accounting firms, and indeed, in any organization that exists today.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Students are encouraged to apply to the Marriott School of Management during their junior year, as soon as they have completed the prerequisite courses. Marriott School majors are limited enrollment programs and the application process is competitive. For assistance in preparing for the application process, it is highly recommended that students visit the Marriott School Advisement Center.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION:

All new students entering the Marriott School commence their study at the beginning of fall semester. Admission into the Marriott School is based on consideration of the following:

- GPA in prerequisite courses
 - 500-word essay
 - A review of the overall academic record
- Prerequisite courses must be completed before the application deadline. Any application with a prerequisite GPA below a 3.0 will not be considered. When prerequisite GPA is calculated, repeated or transferred courses will be discounted. See the Marriott School Advisement Center for more information.

**Applicants must receive at least a B in both Acc 200 and Acc 310 in order to be eligible to apply.

Note: Repeating of any prerequisite course to improve grades is not advisable, as they will be discounted a full letter grade.

TRANSFER INFORMATION:

No more than 12 credit hours of upper-division transfer credit will be accepted toward the major, and only 6 hours beyond the management core. Transfer equivalencies for the following courses will not be considered: Acc 320, IS 201, M Com 320.

Note 1: If a student must leave the program for a mission, military service, or other reason, a leave of absence request form is required. A prompt return to the program is required. Students who have interrupted their SOA education for more than two years without prior approval will be required to meet the requirements of the program in effect at re-acceptance.

Note 2: Upper-division accounting class credits earned prior to five years before graduation may not be used to meet specific graduation requirements for the BS degree.

BS ACCOUNTING, CONCURRENT WITH MAcc:

The first year of the SOA program must be completed with a minimum 3.0 GPA to be eligible to apply for continuation into the Master of Accountancy Program. The management core courses are replaced by the Marriott School of Management graduate core. Students planning to pursue a master of accountancy degree should not take the management core courses.

**Note: The sequence of courses suggested may not fit the circumstances of every student. Students should contact their advisement center for help in outlining an efficient schedule.

Note: This major requires a minimum of 120 hours for graduation. Students are encouraged to complete an average of 15–16 credit hours each semester or 30–31 credit hours each year, which could include spring and/or summer terms. Taking fewer credits substantially increases the cost and the number of semesters to graduate.
