THE DISCIPLINE:

The Department of Art serves three main purposes:

- 1) to prepare competent professionals in various fields of art;
- 2) to prepare art educators for teaching art at the elementary and secondary levels; and
- 3) to generally develop individuals' aesthetic sense by helping them experience art.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

The art education degree certifies the student as an art specialist, grades K-12, in public or private institutions. Other opportunities for the certified art specialist are in foreign school systems, recreation programs, art museum education programs, and galleries. Students qualify for positions in artist-in-the-schools programs and arts councils and as art critics and arts consultants/coordinators. The degree also provides a foundation for graduate study leading to advanced degrees.
