**THE DISCIPLINE:**

Academic preparation in this interdisciplinary education program includes study in the areas of early childhood development, marriage and family relationships, parenting education, housing and interiors, clothing and textiles, and nutrition and wellness.

With the development of a knowledge base in these critical areas, graduates will be prepared to provide valuable content to secondary education students as they confront life's challenges. These students can become a resource to their own families empowering them to become healthy community contributors.

This program interfaces with the McKay School of Education and includes professional education courses.

**CAREERS:**

This program prepares students to be licensed by the Utah State Office of Education for teaching in public, private, and charter secondary education schools. This teaching license can be transferred to other states upon meeting individual state requirements. Students may also find employment in business and cooperative extension.

**RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES:**

**INTERNSHIPS:**

Internships are granted by individual school principals on an "as needed" basis. They are an August to June contract and are applied for in January, the winter semester prior to the upcoming Fall school year.

Selection of interns is done through a competitive process. Participation in an internship does not guarantee employment.

Cougar FACS Club is a student affiliate of the Utah Family and Consumer Sciences and National Family and Consumer Sciences organizations.

**FINANCING:**

Many students work up to 20 hours per week. Some find employment on campus and some junior and senior students obtain teaching or research assistantships. Many of our students obtain summer jobs that make use of their training and interests.

**SCHOLARSHIPS:**

**Note:** Students are encouraged to complete an average of 16–17 credit hours each semester or 32–34 credit hours each year, which could include spring and/or summer terms. Taking fewer credits substantially increases the cost and the number of semesters to graduate.

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
